

## “Anybody Home?” Quilt

Approx. size 44” x 50”

You’ll need:

9 -12 1/2” house blocks (36 houses: vary the colors of the houses, hearts and roofs for variety. - see block details below)

6 vertical sashing strips (2 1/2” x 12 1/2”)


4 horizontal sashing strips (2 1/2” x 40 1/2”)

Vertical Borders: 2 1/2” x 44 1/2”

Outer Border: Vertical: 3 1/2” x 44 1/2”; Horizontal: 3 1/2” x 50 1/2”

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Assemble 3 rows with three (3) 12 1/2” house blocks per row.
2. Separate each house block with a 2 1/2” vertical sashing strip.
3. Separate each row with a 2 1/2” sashing strip.
4. Add a 2 1/2” inner border using the same sashing fabric, to quilt top.
5. Add 3 1/2” outer borders to finish quilt.



### BLOCKS:

Each 12 1/2” block has four (4) 6 1/2” house patches.

To make one House Patch you’ll need:

Background Fabric: (2) 3” squares

Roof Fabric: (1) 3” x 5 1/2” rectangle

House: (1) 4” x 5 1/2” rectangle

Heart: (1) 3” square of heart fabric

Background vertical border: (2) 1” x 6 1/2” rectangles

Fusible webbing (1) 3” square

1. Make roof with the background fabric and roof fabric using the “One seam Flying Geese block method”.

2. Add the 4” x 5 1/2” rectangle (house fabric) to the roof of the house with a 1/4” seam.

3. Draw, with a pencil, a heart approximately 2” tall on the paper side of the fusible webbing. As per package instructions, fuse the webbing to the wrong side of the 3” heart square fabric. Cut out the heart on the pencil line and fuse to the center of the house (3/4” down from the seam where roof meets house). Using a zig zag or applique stitch to secure the heart to the house.

4. Add a 1” x 6 1/2” rectangle to each side of the block using a SCANT 1/4” seam.

Trim block to 6 1/2” square.

5. Sew 4 house patches together to make the 12 1/2” house block.
