## North \& Central Chicagoland, IL Chapter

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This pattern creates two different $171 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ (unfinished) blocks.
To make one Block $A$ and one Block $B$ you will need:
$4-10$ " solid or tone on tone background squares
$2-10$ " print squares
$2-10^{\prime \prime}$ contrasting print squares

## DIRECTIONS:

1. Make two four-patch blocks as follows and press toward the dark fabric.


Here's one example of a quilt using 4 - Block A blocks plus a $3^{\prime \prime}$ finished border.
2. Cut each block on both diagonals.

3. Sew squares together as pictured below. You will create two mirror image squares.

4. Cut block horizontally and vertically, $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the center seams. (Dotted lines)

5. Reposition the double rectangle block pieces as pictured. You can use both Block $A$ and Block $B$ in the same quilt or make two different quilts using 4,6 , etc. of either Block A or Block B. It's a very versatile block!
