## Round \& Rornd

FABRIC:
For each quilt block you will need four $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of a background fabric and four $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of a tone one tone solid.

## DIRECTIONS:

1. Cut $5^{1 / 2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ circles out of the tone on tone fabrics.

2. Place two of the $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ circles, right sides together and sew $1 / 4 \prime$ around the raw edge.

3. Cut the circle in half. Trim seam allowance to $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ and clip curves. Turn right sides out and press.
4. Repeat process making a total of 4 half-circles per block.

5. Place the half circle in between two $51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ background squares that have been placed right sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the edge. Repeat with another half circle and the other 2 background squares to make 2 sections.

6. Place the two sections, right sides together wtih a half circle between each section as pictured. Sew the two sections together and press circles in opposite directions as pictured, creating a pinwheel block.


To make the quilt pictured you will need:
Pinwheel Fabric: 1 yard
Background Fabric: $11 / 4$ yards
Inner Border: $1 / 4$ yard
Outer Border: 1 yard
Binding: $1 / 2$ yard
Backing and Batting: 39" x 57" (Approx. $12 / 3$ yd.)
